Both iterations of *The Moving Art Gallery* are reflective of Dance Place's 45th season theme, "Home is Coming," which explores what it feels like to be *home*, how it is defined, and ultimately expressed, through dance. Coming off the heels of Dance Place's Family Reunion, an intergenerational dance party to celebrate 45 years, these performances feel like a mid-season refresher to invigorate the theme. By pushing boundaries of the genre, both *The Moving Art Gallery* and *ABYSS: post-body* take audiences on a journey that asks us to be both spectator and participant.
