- **Umoja** (Unity)
- **Kujichagulia** (Self-Determination)
- **Ujima** (Collective Work and Responsibility)
- **Ujamaa** (Cooperative Economics)
- **Nia** (Purpose)
- **Kuumba** (Creativity), and
- **Imani** (Faith).

Founded in 1997, Coyaba Dance Theater presents traditional and contemporary West African dance and music, celebrating the diverse ethnic groups and rich cultural traditions of West Africa.
