Dance Place Presents bLUr from Kimberly Bartosik/daela

Bartosik Recently Announced as 2025-2026 Recipient of Carla Perlo Fund for Choreography & Performance

Moving beyond specific narratives of the opioid crisis, this performance uses visceral movement to embody the violent cravings and internal battles of substance abuse. Through repeating cycles, *bLUr* illuminates the urgent fight against these desires and the blurred line between craving and rescue. Experience a raw portrayal of intense longing, forceful intervention, and the struggle for survival.

Last month, Bartosik was announced as a <u>2025-2026 recipient</u> of the <u>Carla Perlo Fund for Choreography and Performance</u>, alongside Ronya-Lee Anderson and Mark Caserta. The Carla Perlo Fund for Choreography and Performance was established by the Howard and Geraldine Polinger Family Foundation in 2017 to honor the career of Dance Place Founding Director Emerita Carla Perlo.

Bartosik admits that this, her first fully commissioned work since March 2020, is very "intense."

"It's the most intense work I've made," said Bartosik, in a Dance Magazine interview.

The Carla Perlo Fund for Choreography & Performance is intended to support the creation of new dance works and residencies at Dance Place. The Howard and Geraldine Polinger Family Foundation's support ensures Dance Place's continued ability to nurture outstanding artists and advance the field of dance.
