Dance Place Announces Spring “Festivals” in Celebration of Milestone 45th Season

WASHINGTON, DC (March 15, 2026): After the success of *PRIME: A Tribute to Returning Home*, Dance Place’s milestone 45th season continues with a series of festivals and related events reinforcing the theme *Home is Coming: Inspiration, Connection, Action*. [District Choreographers Dance Festival](#) (DCDF) (April 18 & 19): Moving to a new slot in the season, and in celebration of DC’s vibrant dance community, *DCDF* highlights the talent of dancers and choreographers based in the DMV. The dynamic performances held over this two-day festival explore themes of return to Dance Place, aligning with the 45th season theme *Home is Coming*.

[Liminal \(LMNL\) Dance Film Festival](#) (April 24-26): Converging international and local voices, *LMNL* presents interdisciplinary art with installations of dance, film and design over a three-day festival. Produced and directed by Dance Place resident company **Orange Grove Dance**, this brand new festival seamlessly brings together 70 films from 18 countries over the three days.

[New Releases](#) (May 8 & 9): Dance Place’s annual mixed-bill showcase is back once again, highlighting the work of emerging artists and choreographers in the DMV. Featuring the 2025 New Releases Commission Artist Recipients **Sydney Goldston** and **Elan Robinson**, *New Releases* fosters the growth of new talent and offers a supportive space for local artists, college students and professionals to receive constructive feedback for their artistry.

[DanceAfrica DC/Coyaba Village Celebration](#) (June 1-7): *DanceAfrica DC/Coyaba Village Celebration* celebrates the rich history and traditions of the African Diaspora through dance, music and culture. The return of this outdoor festival offers a chance to immerse in the diverse ethnic groups within Africa and experience the vibrant spirit through performances, master classes, oral histories and an outdoor market. *DanceAfrica DC* presents the diversity of West African dance through rhythm and community.
